

BEWARE! THE TAX MAN COMETH

Over the past few years, some have promoted the attributes of Cave Creek's opportunity to acquire 4,000 acres of open space from the State Land Trust.

But, this proposed acquisition is nothing more than a chimera (a thing that is hoped for, but in fact is illusory or impossible to achieve).

By law, the State Land Trust is required to get the highest and best value for state land, as the proceeds from land sales pay for public education. Not long ago, Phoenix paid approximately \$15,588 per acre for state trust land in the vicinity of the state trust land annexed by Cave Creek. 4,000 acres at \$15,588 an acre is approximately \$63.5 million.

Please remember, as required by the annexation agreement, Mayor Francia and Councilmen Bunch, McGuire, LaMar, and Esser approved a huge infrastructure expansion for water and sewer costing the Town \$62 million.

LaMar, now looking to drive Cave Creek off the cliff, claims we must have open space, "even if we have to pay for it." Does he think the state is going to give the land to Cave Creek? Of course we have to pay for it and the price is \$63 million. He stated the annexation of the 4,000 acres "is critical to our Town"...and "distinguishes this Town from others." He fails to comprehend that:

- Our massive debt distinguishes our Town from others, not open space,
- The 4,000 acres brings NO revenue to the Town,
- And there is no way the Town can pay for it without a **substantial Property Tax.**

It is time for a reality check.

At the Council meeting on June 15, 2015, Finance Director Robert Weddigen stated there is about \$300,000 a year for open space land acquisition. Town Manager Peter Jankowski indicated up to \$1/2 million per year could be available for funding the purchase.

Let's do the math...we have \$300,000 and up to \$500,000 per year for open space acquisition...

It would take 210 years to pay off \$63 million at \$300,000 per year.

It would take 126 years to pay off \$63 million at \$\frac{1}{2}\$ million per year.

And this is without factoring in interest.

Obviously, there is only one way Cave Creek can afford to buy 4,000 acres for \$63 million. A PROPERTY TAX!

The current Council will bombard us with a steady stream of "propaganda" to justify a Property Tax for open space.

The only way to avoid this is for all of us to unite and say...NO TO AN OPPRESSIVE PROPERTY TAX.

SADDLEBAG WISDOM

If you own at least 2 contiguous acres and up to 5 acres, Cave Creek allows you the following ranch animals per acre:

- 5 large ranch animals (horses, cattle), and
- 10 medium ranch animals (goats, sheep), and
- 20 small ranch animals (chickens, ducks).

In other words, if you own 5 acres (DR190), you can, by law, have 25 horses, and 50 goats, and 100 chickens all at one time for a grand total of 175 ranch animals. There is no place quite like Cave Creek.
